

Getting Started



Who May Participate?

Anyone younger than 18 may participate in AKC events. Junior Showmanship (Conformation) requires the Junior to be between the ages of 9 and 18. The requirements for juniors vary with each event. To find more information about requirements for showing in Juniors, visit www.akc.org/kids_juniors.

FAQs

- 1. How do I join the AKC Junior Organization? Everyone who has a Junior Showmanship number is automatically entered in the AKC National Junior Organization, which allows you to participate in events. Getting a Junior Showmanship number is easy. Call (919) 816-3776 and leave your name, address and birth date; e-mail: juniors@akc.org; use our online Junior Showmanship Request Form.
- 2. What is a Junior Showmanship number, and do I need to have one to compete in AKC events?

A Junior Showmanship number is a number you use when you enter an event. It is used to track your wins and determine eligibility for Open competition. In Performance Events your Junior number is linked to the dog's results to recognize your handling the dog to a title.

- 3. What dogs are eligible to show in Juniors?

 To enter a dog in a Conformation Junior Showman-ship Class the dog must be eligible for entry in an AKC Dog Show or Obedience Trial. This means the dog must be AKC registered and purebred. This includes dogs that have Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) or Limited Registration status.
- 4. Can a Junior handler show a spayed or neutered dog in Junior Showmanship competition?

 Yes.
- 5. What if I don't own a purebred dog? Can I show someone else's?

Each purebred dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather, or grandmother, including the corresponding step and half relations, or by a member of the Junior Handler's household.

6. Is there a special Junior class for Performance Events?

There is not a special class, however Juniors are recognized for competing in all the Performance Events. A Junior handling a dog to a Performance title will receive a certificate and a specially designed pin.

American Kennel Club, participants and spectators alike are given the chance to appreciate the full range of beautiful and healthy purebred dogs. Preparing to show or to work these wonderful animals requires dedication, commitment and patience, for both dog and handler. In turn, this produces the greatest benefit of all — strengthening of the ancient and noble bond between dog and man.
